

List of proprietary Chinese medicines with label or package insert not complied with the Chinese Medicines Regulation

According to the Chinese Medicine Ordinance (Cap 549), no person shall sell, or have in his possession for the purpose of selling, any proprietary Chinese medicine (pCm) unless the package of the pCm is labeled in the prescribed manner and has a package insert which complies with the prescribed requirements as set out in sections 26 and 28 of the Chinese Medicines Regulation.

From 1st December 2011 onwards, the Department of Health will conduct routine surveillance for the compliance of requirements for labeling and package inserts of pCm in the market. If a pCm is found not complying with the legal requirements, it must be removed from sale immediately.

The pCm can only be put on sale in the market again when the label and the package insert are rectified in compliance with legal requirements and approved.
